- Southern Villages War Memorial The Committee acknowledges that the Southern Villages War Memorial (inclusive of the flag poles), as defined under the Wingecarribee Shire Council policy on Management of Cenotaphs and War Memorials (revision currently under public consultation), is under the stewardship of the Bundanoon RSL Sub-Branch. The BCA has been advised and accepts the situation.
- Increase in membership fees the Committee resolved to increase Membership fees from \$5 per annum to \$10 per annum or from \$20 for five years to \$40 for five years. Further correspondence will be sent to members are renewal.

The Bundanoon Memorial Hall is getting all spruced up with a touch up paint job of the stage edging, and other chipped architraves ready for Winterfest fun!

There was a comment in town that our Hall is the busiest Hall in all NSW. I think our Hall Booking Volunteer would agree!

I would like to thank Annette who volunteered to be one of our wonderful Hall Willing Worker and has been diligent in her role but with her other commitments, we are now looking for another new Hall Willing Worker or Workers. It's not too much hard work, just checking the Hall after events, like lights off, heaters off, rubbish out and doors are locked.

There is now a \$50 re-chair stacking fee if chairs aren't stacked correctly. We have a diagram on the inside of the chair cupboard, a trolley and clearly marked chairs with orange and yellow dots that have their own special places. People often wonder why we have these chairs dotted with either yellow or orange dots.

This is the reason - the yellow dotted chairs, which all live in the Supper Room, and the orange dotted chairs which live way back in the chair cupboard in two stacks of nine, is because they have a different profile from the rest of the chairs.

How did this happen you ask? Well, 150 chairs were once purchased and then it was decided a little later that an extra 30 chairs or so where needed. But the new chairs had different legs and shape so they do not stack with the original chairs. If you mix them up, the stacks are wobbly and dangerous. And there you have it.

- c) 90th Anniversary of the Soldiers' Memorial Hall committee resolved to host event, in consultation with other interested parties. Due to current Hall bookings the event is planned as a Morning Tea at 10am on the 19th October the 90th Anniversary.
